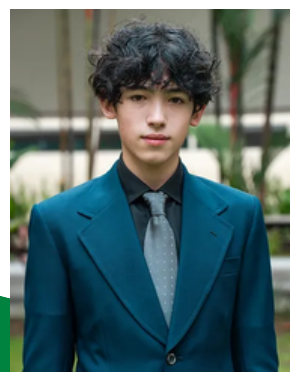

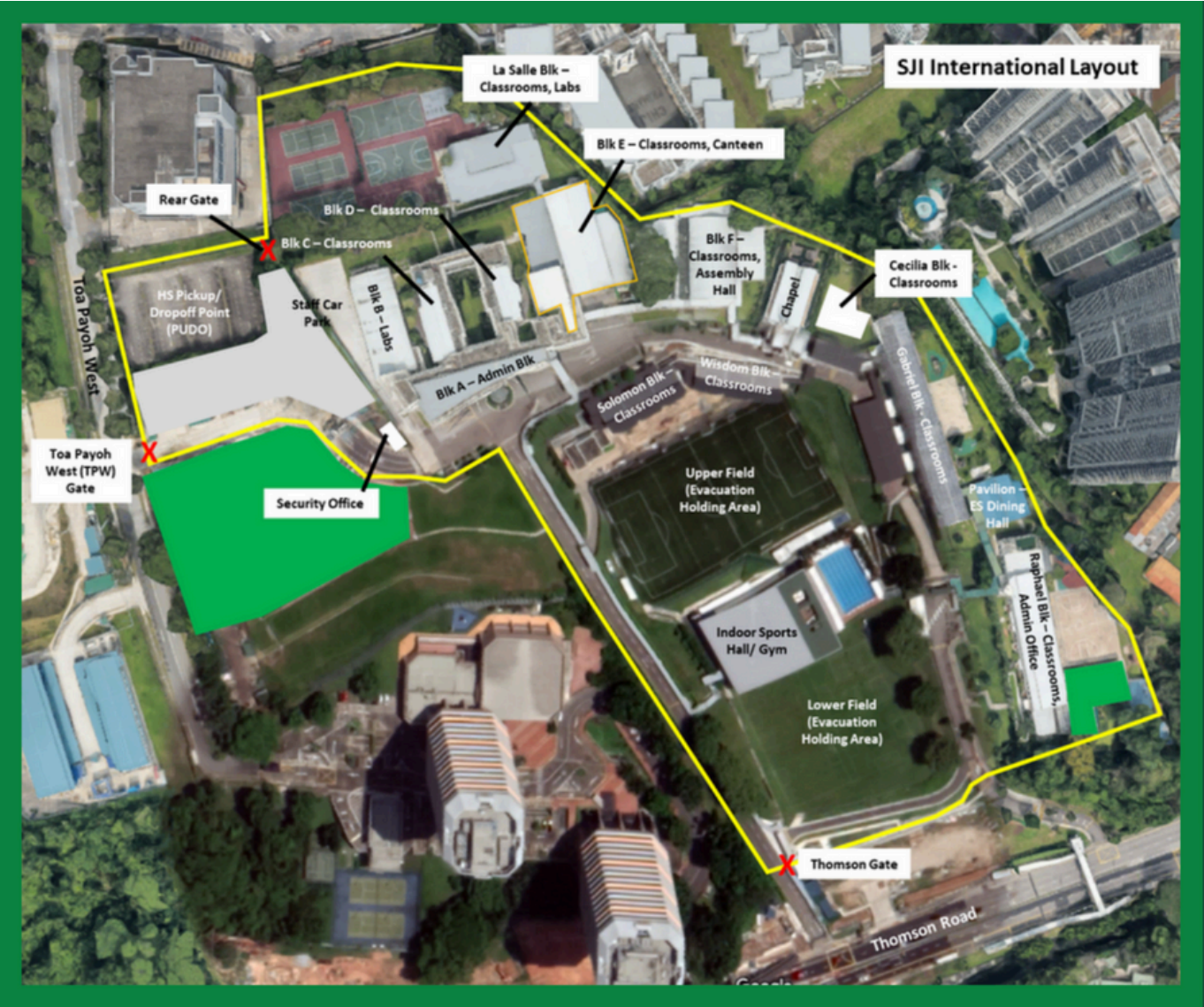

Safety And Security

Arrival, Signing in and Credentials

Please arrive via the Toa Payoh West Gate and sign-in at the Guardhouse by showing our Security Team your lanyard. This would have been given to you during registration on Saturday. Ensure that you wear your lanyard at all times during the conference. If you lose your lanyard, please inform an Admin immediately, who will then contact the Secretariat.

Fire Evacuation Protocol

In the event that the fire alarm rings, the Admins will guide you to the assembly point at the Top Field beside the Solomon and Wisdom blocks. Please leave your belongings and proceed in a silent, orderly fashion to the site. There, you will be assembled by school, as indicated below. Remain silent and in single-file as your Director takes attendance.

Lockdown Protocol

In the event of a lockdown, an alarm will sound over the speaker system. Upon hearing it, enter the nearest classroom immediately. Staff members will call out to students in corridors to bring them into a classroom before closing and locking the door. Close the blinds on all windows. Put cell phones on silent. No voice calls should be made during this time. Remain calm and sit silently under tables. If you cannot get to a classroom in time, find an area to hide, or run for help*. It is recommended to avoid bathrooms, but if an alternative safe space cannot be found, they may be used as a hiding space.

*Emergency contacts: Ambulance & Fire SCDF is 995; Police Emergency is 999.

Expectations

Dress Code

Female

For female delegates, the expected clothing combination is the following:

- Formal dress.
- Formal trousers, skirts (such as pencil skirts), blouses, and/or shirts.
- Formal flat shoes or modest business heels (no more than three inches tall).

Please ensure that any skirts and/or dresses, if worn, are no shorter than fingertip length when standing straight.

Male

For male delegates, the expected clothing combination is the following:

- Formal trousers.
- Long-sleeve button-down dress shirt.
- Tie.
- Blazer.
- Formal dress shoes.

Suspenders and other clothing garments specific to formal business wear are permitted. However, all clothing combinations should be modest in colour.

Any delegates seen to be violating the dress code on the first day of the conference will be issued a warning by the Secretariat and asked to ensure they return in formal attire.

If a delegate violates the dress code more than once, they will not be allowed to enter their committee room until they have changed to the appropriate attire.
